Dr. Susan Azbell, Ouachita Technical College vice president Center for Workforce Excellence, and dean for instructional and Finance and Administration, student affairs, announced that Self-Study Committee and the Arkansas Department of Library Learning Resource Cen-Higher Education had approved ter, to submit a short monthly four new academic programs for report of their activities to the OTC at Tuesday night's monthly meeting of OTC's Board of Trustees.
