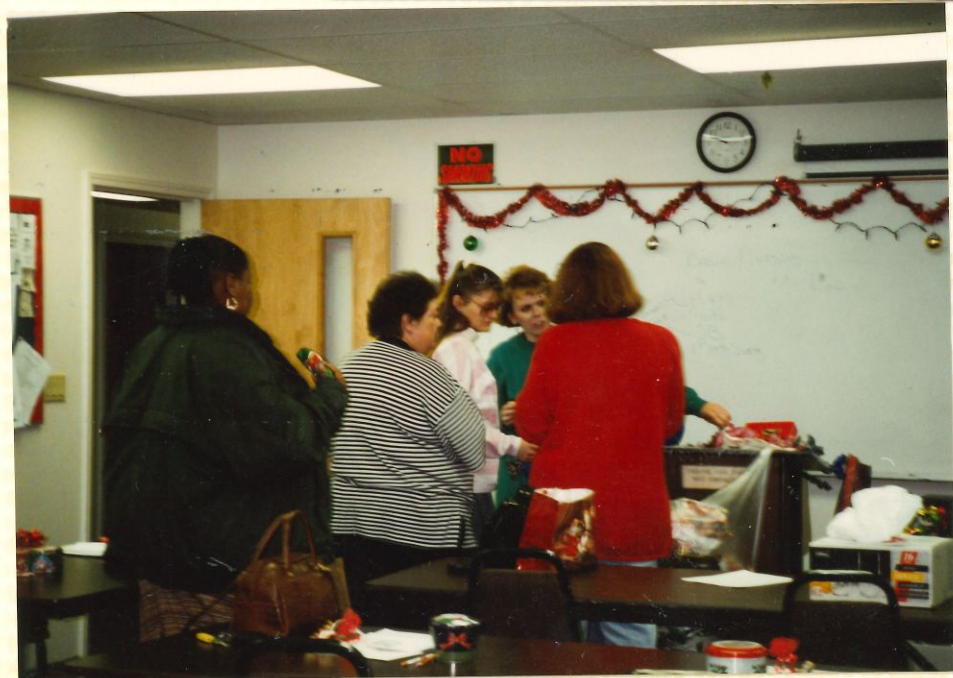

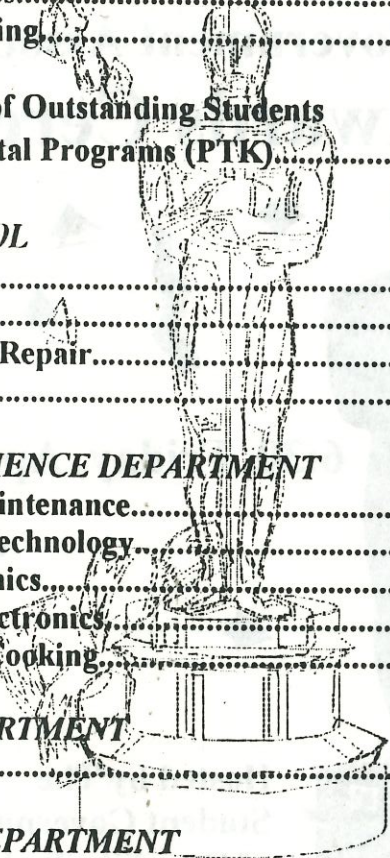

State board OKs OTC programs

Dr. Susan Azbell, Ouachita Technical College vice president and dean for instructional and student affairs, announced that the Arkansas Department of Higher Education had approved four new academic programs for OTC at Tuesday night's monthly meeting of OTC's Board of Trustees.

Associate's degrees in computer information systems and management and supervision, along with technical certificates in computer repair and auto service will be added to the curriculum.

Three other programs are expected to be approved in a special session later this year, Azbell said. They are an associate's degree in paralegal studies and certificates of proficiency in legal secretarial and medical transcription.

"(ADHE) is excited about the paralegal studies because there is only one other two-year college in the state that offers a paralegal program," Azbell said.

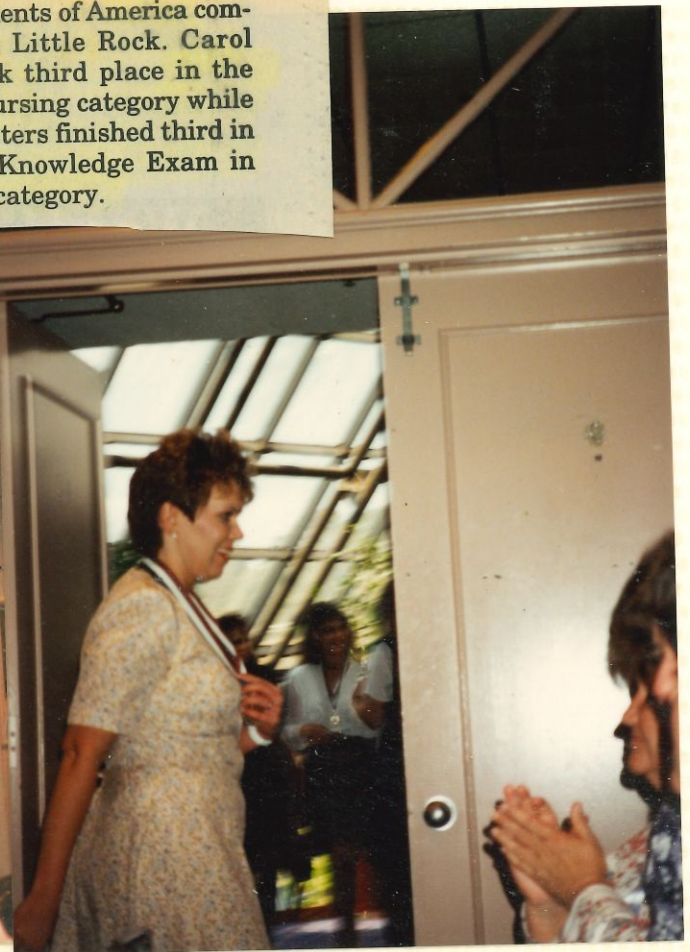
The board passed a motion

requiring all of the major units of OTC — Student Services, Academics, The Foundation Board, Center for Workforce Excellence, Finance and Administration, Self-Study Committee and Library Learning Resource Center, to submit a short monthly report of their activities to the Board of Trustees.

"How can the board be accountable if we don't know what's going on?" trustee LaNoire Dawkins Leeper asked.

Azbell reported to the board the OTC winners at the recent Phi Beta Lamda conference business competition. Shara Sievers took first place and Vickie Wallace took third in Records Management. Cheryl Brazil took third place in Machine Transcription.

Nursing Instructor Leah Costello announced the OTC winners of the recent Health Occupation Students of America competition in Little Rock. Carol Hasley took third place in the practical nursing category while Elaine Masters finished third in the Skills Knowledge Exam in Geriatrics category.

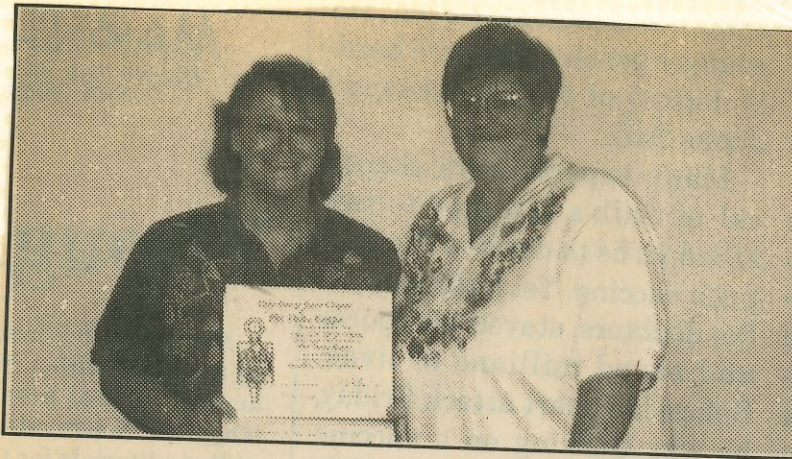
