





• Former Democratic Rep. Lacy Landers of Benton, who unsuccessfully sought higher office after 32 years in the House.

Landers, a former House speaker, will lobby for the Arkansas Community Bankers Association and the Rural Arkansas Telephone Association. He said he also might represent healthcare interests during the session.

Arkansas Community Bankers Association is composed of 142 state-chartered banks. The telephone association is made up of independently owned telephone

companies.

"It's a new day for me," Landers said. "This is going to be kind of interesting."

Landers finished third in the four-person Democratic primary for secretary of state.
