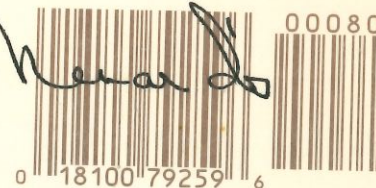

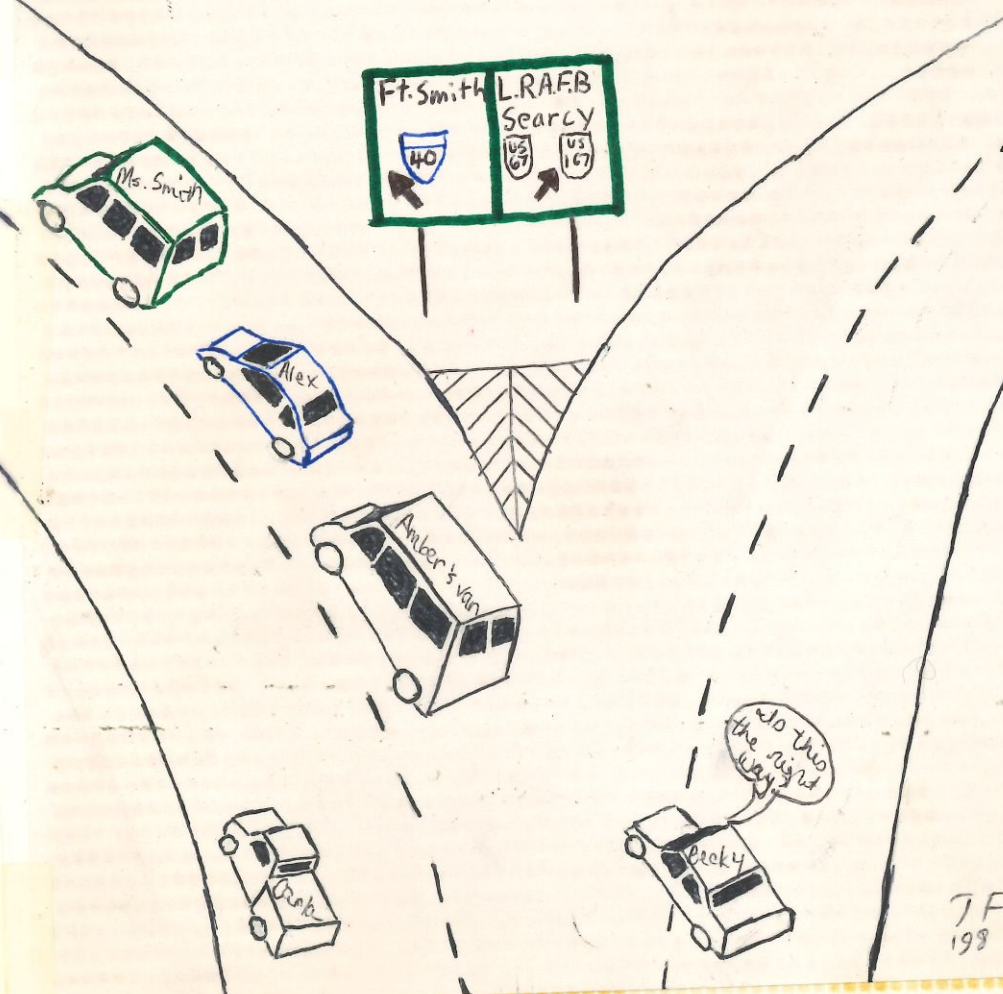

# Psychologist brings specialty, child psychology, to Malvern

Dr. Julie Prince Howard has spent many years learning about the mind and has brought her psychology expertise back home to Malvern to work with children in her own private practice.

Howard has recently moved into her office at 1121 Dyer Street off the corner of Sullenberger and has begun to accept patients. She graduated from Malvern High School in 1985 with aspirations of getting into the chemistry field, she said.

She attended the University of Arkansas at Little Rock as a chemistry major until she took a psychology class. After that she fell in love with psychology and the helping aspect of it.

She loves to work with children so she decided to specialize in child psychology. She received her

Bachelor's of Arts and Psychology degree in 1989 at UALR and proceeded to Florida State University where she obtained her Master's of Science and Clinical Psychology degree in 1991 and Doctorate of Clinical Psychology in 1994.

Howard has been working as an assistant professor at University of Arkansas Medical School and has been working in the Child Study Center at Arkansas Children's Hospital.

She said there was a great need for a child psychologist in Malvern. She noticed that many children from Malvern would be referred to the Child Study Center at Little Rock.

Howard said, "Why not stay here?"

She took it as an opportunity to come back home and do something for the community. Howard thought she could be more effective in Malvern and it

By working in her hometown she could get more involved with the schools, and day care centers. She can set up workshops for the local schools and care providers, Howard said.

She can go to schools to observe children and work with the teachers to develop

compensating strategies for students. She also works with family and group therapy and studies Attention Deficit Disorder and Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder, Howard said.

"I like addressing a need. It can be real tough at times but I like helping people. Many parents put the needs of their children before their needs and I like to help these children to have the best shot at life. I want to help people deal with

problems in a productive way," Howard said.

She continues to work at the Child Study Center on Mondays and Tuesdays. Her office in Malvern is open Wednesday through Saturday morning.

Most insurance companies are accepted through UAMS. Soon Howard will be able to accept insurance and Medicaid through her private practice.

Probably the best thing to do if someone feels their child has a problem that needs to be addressed though a psychologist is to see their primary care physician and get a referral, Howard said.

Getting a referral is not mandatory.

There is nothing wrong with someone calling Howard at her office and asking questions about things that concern them with their children to see where they need to go from there, Howard said.

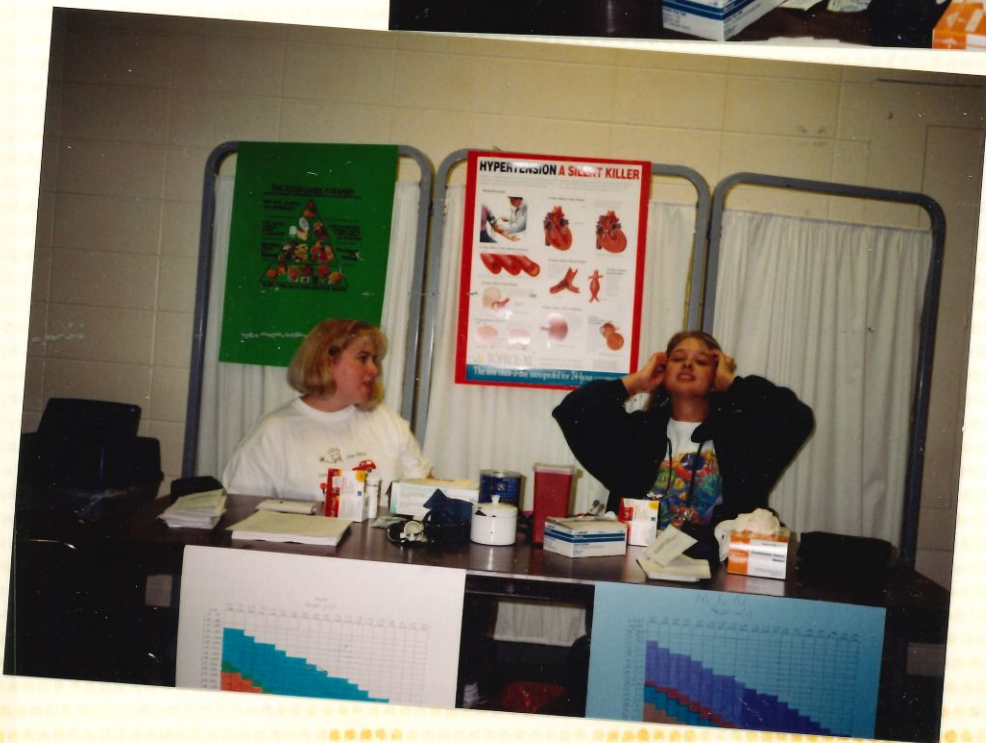

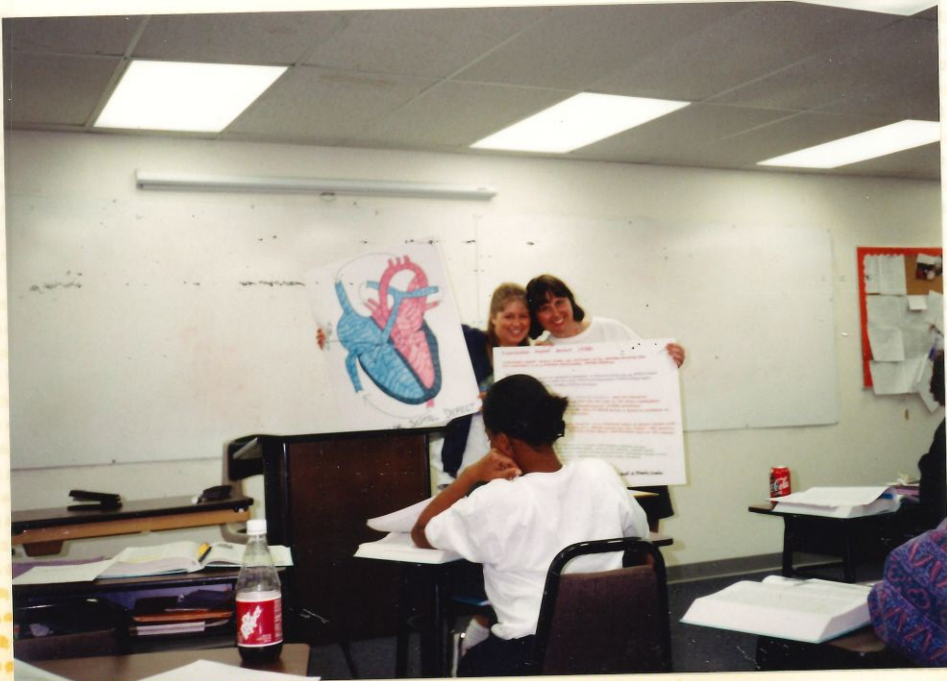










































## *Nurses in Flight*

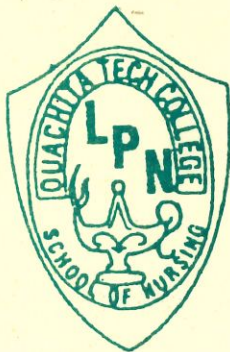

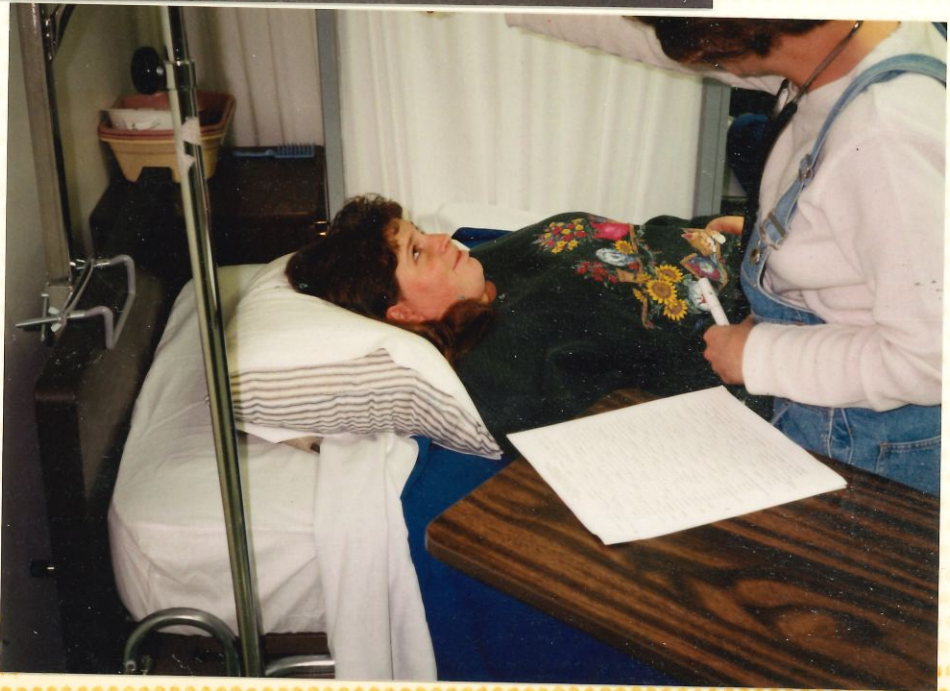
