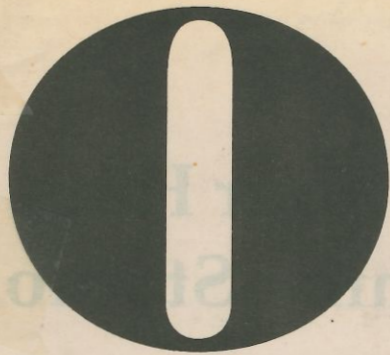

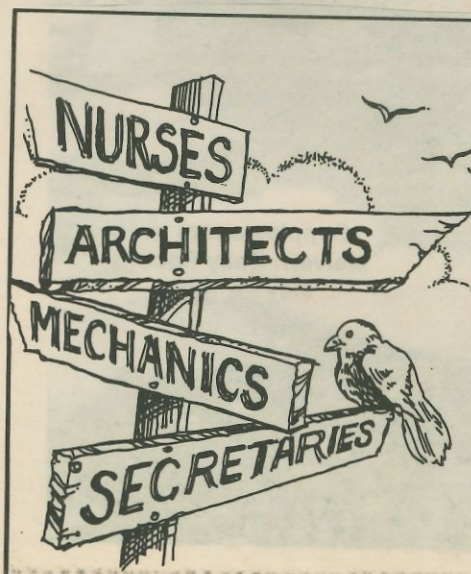

# A.B.E., G.E.D. classes offer advancement

Newly expanded programs at Ouachita Technical College will provide residents throughout Hot Spring County with the opportunity for advancement.

The college's Adult Basic Education and General Equivalency Diploma programs were recently broadened to include all of Hot Spring County.

Now, interested persons in all areas of the county will have convenient access to adult education classes. Previously, classes were only offered in different locations in Malvern.

With the help of a \$250,000 grant, Ouachita Technical College, has been able to hire the additional staff required to expand the program's locations. Expansion money will also be used to fund new classes in the program.

According to Brenda Keisler, an adult education instructor, enrollment in the program has risen dramatically in the past four years. The number of students graduating has also increased each year.

Last year, approximately 900 students in the Malvern area were assisted by the program, either through on-campus courses or through satellite programs.

With the program's current expansion of course locations throughout the county, the number of students served can only be expected to grow.

By expanding the availability of the adult education programs, Ouachita Technical College will help students attain the high school equivalency diploma needed for better employment, as well as help increase literacy in our county.

# New technical colleges to offer basic courses

Students who want to begin a college career next month will have a dozen new choices of Arkansas schools.

The state Board of Higher Education approved funding Friday for freshman and sophomore college courses to be offered at 12 newly created technical colleges throughout the state. The colleges used to be vocational-technical schools.

Edward Crowe, associate state higher education director, said the courses would be offered in the upcoming academic year through cooperative programs between the technical colleges and existing two-year or four-year institutions.

For example, he said, the courses at Pulaski Technical College in North Little Rock will be administered by the University of Arkansas at Little Rock.

Each of the 12 technical colleges

must offer 15 classes, including five developmental courses that don't count for credit toward a degree and at least three freshman or sophomore courses that would transfer to other colleges or universities.

Students who are required to have remediation because of their college entrance examination scores must take the developmental courses, which include developmental math, elementary algebra, intermediate algebra, reading and English composition.

Credit given for taking course work other than the developmental courses could be used to apply toward a bachelor's degree at the sponsoring two-year or four-year institution or transferred to any other institution in the state, Crowe said.

# OTC begins search for college president

When the Board of Trustees of Ouachita Technical College meet in executive session Tuesday afternoon to open and review applicants for the position of college president, one name will be missing from that list of applicants. Earl Clevenger, presently the director at OTC, said this morning that he'd decided not to toss his hat in the ring.

Clevenger said he'd earlier considered making a bid for the position of president, but had since elected not to pursue the position. Clevenger said he would hope to remain at the school in some capacity even after a president is named.

Dewey Stiles, OTC board of trustee member and chairman of the committee on hiring a president, said well over 100 applicants for the position of president have been received. The deadline for applicants was Saturday.

The board had two advertisements published in *The Chronicle*, a maga-

zine distributed to colleges and universities nationwide. Stiles said the ad outlined information about the area, the population and called the salary "competitive."

"We've had them (applications received) from all sections of the country," Stiles said this morning. "We've had them from New York, Texas, the Carolinas."

Stiles said no target date is involved in making the selections, but said a minimum of five applicants had to be turned over to the State Department of Higher Education for approval. The OTC board will make the final selection.

"It'll take some time," Stiles said of considering the applications. "I would say two or three weeks I'm sure. The committee will decide the procedure (Tuesday afternoon) but we don't have a target date."

The qualifications the board is seeking requires either a doctor's

# OTC board to narrow applicants

Ouachita Technical College is another step closer to naming a president.

Dewey Stiles, chairman of the committee to narrow the list to five candidates, said Friday the number of applicants being considered has dwindled to 13.

When OTC began its search for a president, an advertisement was published in *The Chronicle*, a magazine circulated nationwide to colleges and universities. From that, 105 applications for the position were received.

The committee sent letters to the 13 finalists, notifying them of the situation and inquiring whether the applicants were still interested. Stiles said of those letters sent, nine have responded positively. Stiles said he expected more.

"Wednesday, I'd like you to mark your top five,"

Stiles told the full board of the process of elimination.

OTC Director Earl Clevenger distributed to the board copies of the request for legislative appropriations for fiscal years ending June 30, 1994 and 1995.

In the institutional goals, objectives and strategies for the 1993-95 biennium, the report explained additional instructors will need to be hired to teach new programs or assist existing instructors. This will allow instructors to devote more time to classroom presentations and lab experience.

OTC finance director Bob Jones told the board the school has "everything we needed to submit" to the Department of Higher Education for approval of the budget.

The board will meet again Wednesday at 5:30 p.m.

# Ouachita Technical College offers new programs

Registration is currently going on at Ouachita Technical College for the vocational/technical classes scheduled to begin on August 26, 1991.

Several openings now exist in most programs including automotive technology, diesel mechanics, machine shop welding, industrial equipment maintenance and repair, air conditioning and refrigeration, electronic technology business data processing, business secretarial and food service management. According to information provided by the Employment Security Division (ESD), most of these programs are on the statewide occupational demand training list, thus providing participants with excellent employment opportunities upon completion of the training.

On July 1, 1991, Ouachita Vocational Technical School officially became Ouachita

Technical College to be operated under the guidance of the Department of Higher Education.

This transition will make it possible for Ouachita to offer college level courses under the auspices of an accredited higher education institution. The Department of Higher Education has appointed Henderson State University to work cooperatively with Ouachita in order to offer college courses.

College level courses will include both developmental and core curriculum courses. Five developmental courses will be offered. They include developmental math, elementary algebra, college intermediate algebra, college

reading skills, and developmental English. The core curriculum courses are college algebra, humanities art, civilization to 1660, introduction to philosophy American national government, and freshmen English.

Henderson State University will hire a person to coordinate registration and scheduling for the classes. Most classes will be at night. The news media will be notified as more information is learned pertaining to the schedule and registration date. However, interested persons are encouraged to come by Ouachita Technical College and complete an application before registration.

Tuition for the technical classes or college classes will be \$20 per credit hour, not to exceed \$240 per semester. Financial aid is available from several sources. Ouachita Technical College can provide patrons with information and the

necessary application forms. The Counseling Center at Ouachita should be contacted for further information

The SSET basic skills assessment will be used to place students in the appropriate math and English courses, both at the college level and the technical level. The SSET will be offered free of charge at 8:00 a.m. or 1:00 p.m. each Thursday or Friday of each week until classes begin on Aug. 26.

The ASSET or the ACT will be used to place those students having been out of high school for three years or more. Only the ACT will be used for placement of those students graduating from high school less than three years ago.

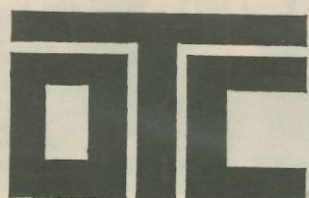

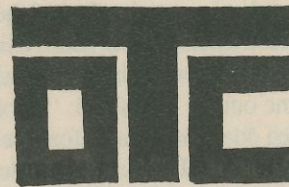

# College trustees approve tuition hike

A \$5 per semester hour tuition increase to be tacked on to the present \$20 per semester hour at Ouachita Technical College was approved Wednesday in the OTC Board of Trustees meeting.

The increase was passed, despite concern from board member Bonnie Jean Stanley that some enrollment decline might be involved. After being told over 90-percent of the students enrolled at OTC are receiving financial assistance for tuition, the board generally agreed the student population wouldn't be affected.

The board again tabled a motion to obtain an attorney for the school, which would assist in obtaining compliance in the school's transition from a vocational institution to a college. Board chairman George McClure Jr. said the Department of Higher Education was unsure of where the money for an attorney would come from, and until that was learned the board probably should wait to make such a move.

OTC has been in the process of establishing a foundation to raise funds for the school's operations.

McClure appointed the Finance Committee to serve as the core of a Foundation Committee to research ways a foundation could be established and return to the full board with recommendations at the next meeting.

OTC's direction will be decided by the Mission Statement volunteers. McClure and board member Jim Crownover will serve on the committee to establish a direction the institution will take as a college.

"It (mission statement) tells what direction we're going to go — what is our goal," OTC Director Earl Clevenger said. "It's the key factor in any school. This is the most critical thing we can do."

Clevenger said goals such as faculty excellence and the desire to serve

the community were goals other schools had outlined.

OTC has one off-campus building and a feasibility study could determine if another is needed. Clevenger said "a couple" of people had approached the school about renting buildings to OTC, but Clevenger said learning whether or not those buildings were needed was important.

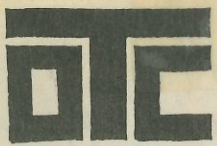
Board member Dewey Stiles expressed his opinion on off-campus buildings.

"I'd like to see this campus grow here instead of having it spread over Hell's Half-Acre," Stiles said of keeping the classes on one property.

Tressie McJunkin, OTC Food Service instructor, has chaired the 20-Year Anniversary Committee and told board members activities April 14, 15, 16, 17 would have OTC in the limelight. April 14 an open house at OTC would kick off the anniversary, followed by a breakfast April 15, an unveiling of the new OTC logo on the 16th and a barbecue the 17th.

Clevenger said over 50 colleges has been written to get an idea of what others are doing to incorporate those ideas into OTC's 1992-93 school catalog.

Brenda Williams was introduced as a new JTPA (Jobs Training Partners Act) instructor.
